Rabbi Wittenberg now confirmed as a Keynote Speaker on Wed 10th July:

He is the rabbi of the New North London Synagogue and takes a leading role in the development of the Masorti Movement for traditional non-fundamentalist Judaism in England. In 2008 he was appointed Senior Rabbi of the Assembly of Masorti Synagogues UK. He has a strong interest in pastoral work, particularly in the care of the sick and dying. He is deeply engaged in Jewish / Christian and Jewish / Muslim interfaith dialogue. He lectures widely and writes frequently for the Jewish and interfaith press. He has broadcast for the BBC on Prayer for the Day, and on Al Mustakillah television.
