The programme is in the context of the demographic changes taking place with a significant increase in the number of older people. The programme's vision is **'that older people in Scotland are valued as an asset, their voices heard and older people are supported to enjoy full and positive lives in their own home or in a homely setting'.**

Our church and faith communities play a vital role in the support of older people and it is important that their role is highlighted and opportunities found to be represented on the 32 Partnership bodies set up in local authority areas in Scotland.
