Loneliness and Isolation

This was the subject of a joint conference with **Interfaith Scotland** which was held in Linlithgow. The presentations and discussion highlighted how complex loneliness and isolation can be and the importance of creating imaginative ways to combat it across all ages. The conference also provided the opportunity to to respond to the Scottish Government consultation on 'Connecting Scotland' to formulate a strategy.

FiOP and Church of Scotland Guild

The third conference of the ecumenical group which we brought together last year to discuss loneliness and isolation focused on dementia and faith communities and the role of the church in supporting end of life matters. There was a really good discussion on both issues which will help FiOP and the Guild to focus on what we need to do next.

FiOP is a stakeholder in Good Life, Good Death, Good Grief, which is a project of the Scottish Partnership on Palliative Care which as part of its remit aims to encourage all of us to have converstions about our wishes, concerns, plans and so.
